CHAMPIONSHIPS This competition is sanctioned by the Lifesaving Society. Event rules will be in accordance with this information package, Section 4 of the *Canadian Competition Manual*, and Section 5 of the 2015 *ILS Competition Rulebook 2017 rev.*. The *ILS Competition Rulebook* and *Canadian Competition Manual* may be viewed or downloaded at www.lifesavingnb.ca.

ELIGIBILITY AND THE RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE Maritime championships are intended for bona fide lifesavers who have demonstrated a commitment to lifesaving – people who are lifesavers first, competitors second. The Lifesaving Society considers it unethical to recruit competitors for their high-performance athletic ability whose lifesaving credentials are tenuous or merely convenient for the purposes of competition. Employers, club management personnel and coaches are the key to preventing such unethical practices and must emphasize "play within the rules" behaviour. The personal conduct of managers and coaches is measured by the ILS code of fair play.

Maritime lifeguard championships are open to affiliated clubs or affiliate members in good standing. An affiliate member or individual member is in good standing unless their registered athlete or affiliate status has been revoked by the Lifesaving Society.

To be eligible to compete, competitors shall:

- Hold a current (within 24 months of the date of certification) Bronze Cross or National Lifeguard certification (any option).
- Be a minimum of 15 years of age as of the first day of the championships.
- Be a registered athlete (download form at www.lifesavingsport.ca or from www.lifesavingnb.ca).

Competitors must be members of the same affiliated club or employees of the same affiliate member of the Lifesaving Society.

A club may consist of any number of teams, in addition to any non-competitive management or coaching personnel.

Competitors may compete for only one club or affiliate member at a time.

Competitors are allowed to enter each event only once.

Composition of a Team

Teams must consist of two members and a minimum of one member must hold a National Lifeguard certification. Teams may consist of any combination of males or females. The same two competitors must enter and complete all three team events. One alternate may be named, but can only be used in the case of injury to or illness of a team member. A team member who is replaced by an alternate may not re-enter the competition. Participation by a third team member (other than the designated alternate) shall result in disqualification from the team awards.

ENTRY DEADLINE	Registration must be received by Monday, October 29th, 2018. Refunds will not be issued for clubs or competitors who do not show for the championships.
ENTRY FEES	First Aid, Priority Assessment, Water Rescue (per team, per event)..... \$25.00 Note: Entry fees include entry to events, awards and insurance
REGISTRATION	All clubs must register prior to the championships in accordance with procedures established. Entry fees must be paid with team registration. Clubs may enter an unlimited number of teams in each event. Each completed registration must include the following: • Registration form with payment. • Waiver and release form. • Event entry form. • Either the registered athlete number for each athlete or a completed registered athlete application. SEEDING Draws for position in First Aid, Priority Assessment, and Water Rescue shall be made by the Head Scorer and supplied to the teams.

In First Aid, Priority Assessment and Water Rescue only an A Final will take place.

SCORING In First Aid, Priority Assessment and Water Rescue, teams shall be allocated points as outlined in the following chart.

Clubs are allowed multiple entries in events. Point score blocking is not used.

AWARDS Team event winners

Awards shall be presented to first, second and third placed teams in each event. Event winners shall be recognized as Maritime Champions.

Overall Team Award

The first place team with the highest overall point score from First Aid, Water Rescue and Priority Assessment shall be declared Maritime Champions.

Clubs from provinces outside the Maritimes may compete in Maritime Championships if endorsed in writing to do so by their Provincial Lifesaving Society. The teams represent their club. They may become champions in team events, but are not eligible for the Maritime championship team title.

Special note: The first place team from New Brunswick with the highest overall point score from First Aid, Water Rescue and Priority Assessment shall be declared New Brunswick Champions and awarded the Tobias Cup

LANGUAGE INTERPRETATION	Clubs who require French and/or English language interpreters must make this known to organizers when registering for the championships. Clubs are encouraged to provide their own interpreters. These interpreters may be a member of their club.
